AT THE LAMBS HIGH FEAST!

Easter is near upon us! First, check out the schedule for Holy Week and Easter. We have services Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and we're again doing an Easter Vigil on Saturday at 7:00pm. Easter Sunday will be a festival Communion service with special music, and breakfast between services. We're having an egg hunt for the kids at about 9:30-9:45am. Sign up to help with Easter Breakfast by brining something (whether you sign up or not!) setting up and taking down. Saturday, 4/8, 9:00am we'll be setting up and decorating for Easter. Come on out!

Lent has been about fasting and refraining. Easter is the time to feast and burst forth with joy for the resurrection of our Lord! Our greatest feast is the Lord's Supper where Christ is both host and feast as He gives us His body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins. So joyous is this that the last several years we've celebrated the Lord's Supper every Sunday, at every service, during the Easter Season. The response from the congregation has been thankfulness for the refreshment that is communion and the joy of sins forgiven. At the congregational forums last fall, we discussed having communion at every Sunday service, year-round.

The Elders and I have decided that it is in the best interest of the spiritual care of the congregation that we indeed move to having communion at every Sunday service. This is a welcome gift and opportunity for all of us to never miss out on the Lord's Supper when we have come to the Lord's house. Any kind of "change" can sometimes feel disruptive. But, rest assured, we embrace positive changes in our lives all the time and when they are for our good, we embrace even the challenges they might present.

You may immediately have some questions about having communion every Sunday. The Elders and I make ourselves available to you for questions and promise to listen and always respond in faithfulness to God's Word and in care for you and everyone in the congregation.

Why celebrate communion at every Sunday service?

Jesus told His disciples, "do this as often as you drink of it in remembrance of me." Do the Lord's Supper, often!

In the book of Acts, the thousands baptized on Pentecost "devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching, the fellowship, the breaking of bread, and the prayers." This is a description of early Christian worship and it included the "breaking of bread" i.e. the Lord's Supper.

For centuries, until about the 1600's every Sunday service (and many services during the week) always included the Lord's Supper.

Why did communion become less frequent?

In the 1600's a movement called "Pietism" placed the emphasis of faith on your experiences and how worship made you feel. The suggestion was that if you had communion every Sunday, it wouldn't "feel" special, and that somehow ruined the effect of the sacrament. How sad to make the effectiveness of God's gifts dependent on how one feels at one point or another. The truth is that God's Word is effective, His gifts deliver, no matter how we feel. By faith, we receive exactly what God promises.

Since the earliest days of the LCMS there has been steady progress toward frequent, weekly, reception of the Lord's Supper. Even here at St. Paul, there has been a steady progression toward more frequent communion.

Before 1950, communion was once, every other month.

1950, it became once, every month.

July 1968, there was a six-month trial of having communion twice a month, but by January 1969 it was back to once a month.

January 1984, it was announced that communion would be celebrated twice a month. Once with the chalice, and once using individual cups.

If that seems surprisingly recent, you're not alone! I think most of us would be familiar with communion twice a month and only once a month would seem very strange. We've come a long way in the past forty years I guess.

Must I take communion every time it is offered?

The short answer is, no. When asking, "Should I receive communion when it is offered?" ask you self this question: do I need what God delivers in communion? Do I need the forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of my faith? There is your answer. I'm sure the answer will be, "yes, I need forgiveness." Thanks be to God that it is here for you!

What about guests and closed communion?

God's Word tells us that those who eat and drink in an "unworthy" manner are guilty of sinning against the Body and Blood of Christ. What does it mean to receive it in an "unworthy" manner? In the Small Catechism we confess that to be worthy is to have faith that the Lord's Supper is FOR YOU, it is

the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.

Communion fellowship is also a unity of doctrine so that where we go to commune, we can faithfully say we believe as they believe. If it is not so, then we should not commune together so that we don't give a false confession of unity.

When someone presents themselves for communion, the congregation (and I as your pastor) have a genuine interest in their spiritual wellbeing and should not deliberately put them in the position of receiving in an unworthy manner or making a false confession of unity.

This is the loving and faithful practice of "closed communion" and it is hopefully the beginning of a conversation about coming to a faithful and unified confession of faith. If you are bringing a guest from a different confession of faith, other than LCMS, please let them know they are welcome to receive a blessing at the communion rail (just cross their arms by touching their opposite shoulders) and that we are certainly glad they will come and hear God's Word. We hope that it will lead to a unity of faith that can be expressed in communing together.

Won't church take FOREVER?!?

Who really complains when a game goes into overtime, a performer does an encore, or you get to spend extra time with a loved one? Communion services take just about one hour. One hour. Please rejoice in that small portion of your week when taken in consideration of how the rest of our time is spent. Set aside the cares of this world for one hour. Add an hour for Bible Study too and you're still spending less time than a typical movie and less than a sporting event. If an hour or two for worship is too much to set aside, please repent and remember that we keep the Sabbath day holy by gladly hearing God's Word and receiving His sacraments. Come and be forgiven and be blessed by this time with God.

At the Lamb's High Feast we Sing!

Every time we gather to worship we celebrate a "little Easter" by proclaiming Christ crucified for sinners and risen for our justification. Now, every time we gather, we will receive the Lord's Body and Blood for the forgiveness of our sins and be made partakers of all the blessings of His suffering and death. Jesus says that His body was broken, FOR YOU and His blood was poured out FOR YOU. Rejoice that when you come to worship, it will be here, FOR YOU!



MISSIONARY UPDATE

Sammy & Kelsey Weber and their four children (Keturah 8, Caleb 6, Timothy 4, Stephen 2) are missionaries to Cameroon, West Africa. They are founders and leadership partners of Vision 4 Cameroon, whose mission it is to carry the good news of salvation to the "unreached" people groups in Cameroon who have never had an opportunity to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Weber family has been serving the Lord from South Dakota since they were medically evacuated from Cameroon in May 2021. Daughter Keturah has been on St. Paul's prayer chain since that time, while she has been undergoing two years of treatment for leukemia cancer. Lord willing, her last spinal injection of chemotherapy will take place at the end of July. If her body remains cancer free after treatments cease, then her injection port can be surgically removed this September and she can be declared successfully healed from leukemia! The family hopes and prays for this outcome. The Weber's also hope is that a cancer-free outcome means they can make plans to return to Cameroon in October 2023.

While waiting to return to their home in Africa, they have been participating in Cameroon Ministry from abroad and through Sammy making short trips to Cameroon. In doing so they have also sought out local ministry opportunities near there temporary home in South Dakota, praying regularly with area pastors and engaging in community outreach programs and activities. We join them in continued prayer for Keturah's health and pray they return soon to their African home and original call to missionary work.
